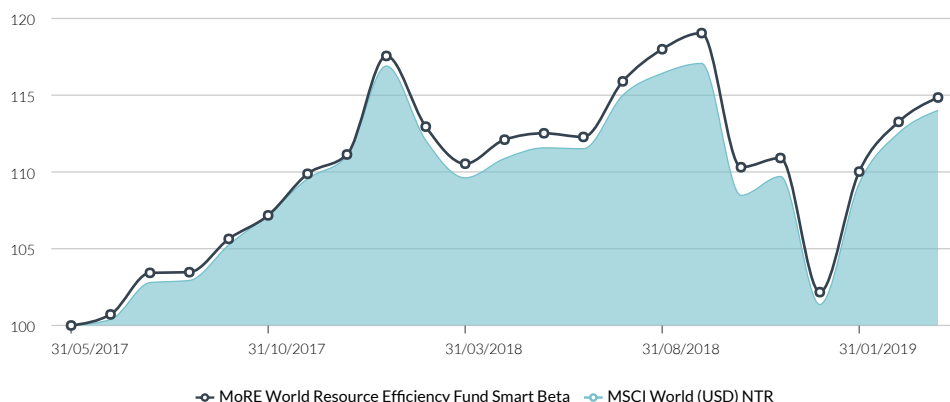

FUND OBJECTIVE

The MoRE World Smart Beta Fund seeks superior risk-adjusted returns by targeting maximum resource efficiency exposure whilst maintaining a tight tracking error to the MSCI World. The portfolio takes advantage of the inefficiencies of market cap weighted strategies by closely mimicking the factor exposure of the underlying benchmark with the active exposure being delivered through the resource efficiency factor. The resulting portfolio delivers a significantly reduced footprint relative to the benchmark.

SELECTION POOL

Top 1400 companies globally by market cap and MSCI World constituent

DISCLOSURE FILTER

Companies that provide disclosure on energy use, water use and waste creation in the public domain

RESOURCE EFFICIENCY SCORE

Based on resource intensity, defined as resource used divided by revenue. Companies have an alpha signal calculated based on the aggregation of all three resource efficiency intensities across each sector. Those companies which do not disclose sufficient data are given a neutral alpha signal.

OPTIMISE ON RESOURCE EFFICIENCY ALPHA SIGNAL

The Resource Efficiency Alpha signal is maximised subject to tight tracking error or constraints to the underlying benchmark. There are tight geography and industry caps as well as minimum holdings and turnover constraints to ensure a fully replicable strategy.

REBALANCED

The strategy is rebalanced on a quarterly basis in line with the underlying benchmark, whereby the resource efficiency data and risk models are updated. The portfolio has been historically more than 45% more resource efficient than the benchmark.

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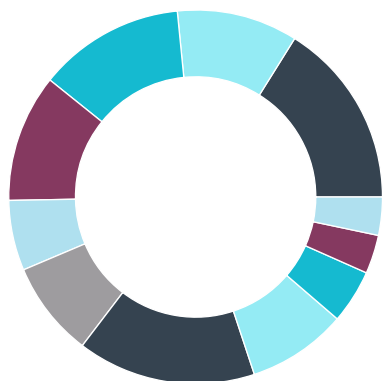

The Fund is a sub-fund of the Prescient ICAV, an open-ended umbrella type investment company, with segregated liability between its sub-funds, authorised by the Central Bank of Ireland to carry on business as an ICAV pursuant to Part 2 of the Irish Collective Asset-Management Vehicles Act 2015, and established as an undertaking for collective investment in transferable securities under the European Communities (UCITS) Regulation, 2011 as amended. It is managed by Prescient Fund Services (Ireland) Limited of 49 Upper Mount Street, Dublin 2, Ireland, which is authorised by the Central Bank of Ireland, as a UCITS Management Company. Osmosis Investment Management UK Limited is the Investment Manager, responsible for managing the Fund's investments.
